1857. Personally appeared before me one of the Justices of
the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid
Jane Dingy of the town of Lisbon and County of Saint
Lawrence and State aforesaid who being duly sworn according
to Law Declares that she is the Identical Widow of Peter
Dingy Deceased, that she is of the age of seventy four
years of age, that she was married to said Peter Dingy
Dingy on the 29th day of September ¹⁸⁰¹ in the town of Argyle Washington
County New York, State by the Rev. George Mairs and that her name
before marriage was Jane McDoyle and that she now resides
in Lisbon aforesaid. And she further testifies that her said
husband was engaged in the war declared by the United States
with Great Britain of June 18th 1812 that he Peter Dingy
Dingy her said husband was pressed by the army of the
United States while on Business at or about at White Hall
New York, self and team and Wagon in transporting the
troops belonging to United States Sacketts Harbor in the
fall of 1812 and that she has made application for Bounty
Land to which she was entitled under act approved March 3^d
1855 which application she has received a Land Warrant
of 160 acres the ^{of the application was} No. of which is 215113. The warrant
has been approved ^{of the applicant} and she says she is now
Now therefore this Dependant further says that her said
husband was actually engaged as teamster as above
stated and she so engaged in such service and away from
home that time of 40 days or over at which time her
husband was very much needed at ^{home} in consequence of having
a small family and being a farmer at which time it proved
the almost entire loss of his crops by his absence. And this
Dependant believes is very confident from his own statements
and from the Taded manner in which his or her said husband
in his close harness wagon and horses appeared after he
returned home that her said husband did not receive any
compensation for his services as teamster during and for the

time he so served as teamster with his own equipage of
wagon and team as above stated And that the Government of
these United are actually Due to this defendant for services of
her said husband at the rate three dollars per day for 40 days
time and the interest thereon since the said services has
been rendered \$120 and interest

This defendant further says that she is the Identical widow of the said
Peter Dings who died on the 25th of June 1848 in the town of Lisbon
and county of said the place where this defendant still resides
and she now remains his widow

Said defendant being by appointy Thomas Craig of
Lisbon her atty & authorizes him to receive & accept for a
certificate for whatever sum may be allowed on the
same & to attend to & procure the settlement of such business
and deposit the same with the United States in any
office or department of the sum & to receive & accept for
all sums of money that may be found due defendant
upon any account or claim now uncollected
